has prepared and released for public review and comment the following:***

***DRAFT FY 2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)
DRAFT Title VI Plan
DRAFT Harrod Comprehensive Plan***

Lima, Ohio (February 1, 2021): At the January meeting of the Executive Committee, the Lima Allen County Regional Planning Commission approved several draft planning documents and released them for public review and comment, as follows:

- DRAFT FY 2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) details Lima-Allen County Regional Planning Commission (LACRPC) work proposed to be completed between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. It identifies nearly two dozen work elements, committing fiscal support from Federal, State, and local sources. The development of the FY 2022 UPWP is mandated by Federal regulations, but also serves to provide benchmarks from which to assess Commission progress and accomplishments.
- DRAFT Title VI Plan describes the LACRPC's commitment to compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, assuring that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, low income status or limited English proficiency be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to, discrimination under any Commission-sponsored program or activity.
- DRAFT Harrod Comprehensive Plan is intended to provide a broad statement of community goals and policies that work together to direct development into the future. The Plan will guide not only land use over the next twenty years, but quality of life, community character, infrastructure, economic development, housing, agriculture, and environmental issues, providing structure within which to achieve future growth.

The documents will be available for 21 days for review and comment during normal business hours at the Lima-Allen County Regional Planning Commission located at 130 W. North Street in Lima, Ohio; staff is available to answer questions.
