## REMEMBERING TOM TEBBEN

LACRPC joins with the Limaland Community in mourning the recent loss of Tom Tebben whose longtime contributions continue to shape the fabric of the Lima community. Tom began his career at Ford Motor Company in 1973, steadily climbing the ladder of leadership responsibilities over three decades until his retirement in 2006 after which he took the entrepreneurial leap by establishing Improvement Ink, LLC. Tom served as the 4th Ward Councilor for Lima City Council for an impressive 15 years to further show his dedication to the community. His contributions significantly benefited the council's effective operation and the overall welfare of Lima's residents.



Tom's commitment to community service continued with his involvement with the Lima/Allen County Regional Planning Commission where he served on multiple committees and as Chairman of the Administrative Affairs Committee beginning in 2010. Tom's enduring legacy as a mentor, community leader, and cornerstone of Lima will forever resonate within the hearts of those who had the privilege of knowing him and his memory will be an everlasting source of inspiration for his loved ones and the Lima community.

## WEST OHIO TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION (WORPO) UPDATE:

Rural Transportation Planning Organizations (RTPOs) play a crucial role in coordinating and facilitating transportation planning efforts within specific geographic regions. Their primary purpose is to ensure that transportation infrastructure and services are developed and managed in a coordinated and efficient manner, addressing the unique needs and challenges of their respective regions. RTPOs bring together various stakeholders, including local governments, transportation agencies, community groups, and the private sector, to collaboratively identify transportation priorities, set goals, and develop comprehensive plans. By fostering this regional perspective, RTPOs help improve transportation connectivity, safety, and accessibility while reducing congestion and environmental impacts.

LACRPC has successfully engaged Choice One Engineering of Sidney, Ohio to begin the development and coordination of the West Ohio Rural Planning Organization (WORPO) and its Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). Choice One Engineering has begun meeting with county commissioners and engineers.

# UPDATED FLOODPLAIN REGULATIONS

The Allen County Commissioners, with the assistance of the Lima-Allen County Regional Planning Commission, The Allen County Prosecutor, and the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) have completed an update of the “Flood Damage Reduction Regulations & Floodplain Management Regulations”. This update was brought about by a compliance check conducted by ODNR’s division of water resources. The newly updated regulations match the federal minimum standards and will allow everyone within the unincorporated areas of Allen County to be eligible to receive flood insurance. The new regulations were approved on July 27, 2023, and went into effect on August 27, 2023.

Throughout the entirety of the Allen County Fair, a display of 247 red MADD ribbons was at the west entrance of the grandstands. These ribbons signified every life lost on Allen County roadways in the last two decades (2002-2022).


