
Liwen Kang: Associate Planner

In an effort to bring awareness and advocacy for seatbelt safety, the Allen County Safe Community Coalition hosted a time for area residents, first-responders and local officials to join in partnership as they kicked off the "Click It or Ticket" campaign in Allen County.

On May 16 at Bath Township Fire Department, Chief Joe Kitchen addressed the public by discussing seatbelt and child restraint safety, seatbelt statistics, and what the current laws are regarding seatbelt usage. It was open to the public and refreshments were donated by Sara's Sweets.

This event was the local kickoff to the nationwide seatbelt campaign. Local and national efforts are designed to help keep people making good choices when it comes to wearing seatbelts and also properly using child seats and restraints.

In Allen County, some area schools also participated in the seatbelt advocacy initiatives, including Allen East Schools. The S.A.D.D (Students Against Destructive Decisions) instructor and students led fourth grade students as they taught an interactive lesson on seatbelt safety. They had learning quiz games and also gave the students the opportunity to simulate a crash by using a toy car, egg carton, a raw egg, duct tape and a cotton ball. In addition, the AE S.A.D.D. students monitored how many people in vehicles were wearing seatbelts upon elementary morning drop-off time.

Local media covered the "Click It" events, and seatbelt safety television PSAs ran throughout April and May on Lima's Hometown Stations/WLIO.


BIKE & PEDESTRIAN COUNTS

FY2025 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM

The Lima/Allen County Regional Planning Commission annually prepares a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) detailing the work it proposes to perform during the upcoming fiscal year (FY). The FY2025 UPWP reflects a timeline from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025, and identifies more than two dozen separate work elements, as well as associated expenditures of \$1,177,023 necessary to support the LACRPC committee structure and staff. In addition, 21 local political subdivisions contribute \$113,780 to support local planning services and the seven West Central Ohio Rural Transportation Planning Organization (WORPO) counties contribute \$21,608 to support regional planning services. The UPWP provides not only specific details about the LACRPC, its mission, organizational structure and responsibilities, but also provides the rationale and justification for planned activities. The UPWP is presented to both federal and state agencies for review and approval before adoption by the LACRPC Board of Directors and includes:

- Tasks to be completed over the fiscal year
- Identification of all funding sources
- Identification of federal and/or state-funded studies
- Identification of significant studies not funded with federal and/or state funds
- Identification of responsible federal and/or state agencies
- Schedule of activities
- Identification of local stakeholders

Planning emphasis areas for the FY2025 Work Program include:

- Implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
- Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Capital Programs Management
- Development of 2026-2029 Statewide Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP/STIP) Transport Ohio Implementation (freight)
- Title VI Environmental Justice

The FY2025 UPWP has been made available for review online at the LACRPC website (www.lacrpc.com) and a copy is also available in the LACRPC office at 130 W. North St., Lima on weekdays between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

ANALYSIS OF IMPEDIMENTS

The Planning Commission recently worked with staff and members of the City of Lima, West Ohio Community Action Partnership (WOCAP), the Allen Metropolitan Housing Authority and the Allen County Housing Consortium to update the 2019 Analysis of Impediments: Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing Choice (AI).

Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 prohibits discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, national origin, familial status, and disability. Section 808(e)(5) of the Fair Housing Act requires that all communities receiving federal financial assistance to administer housing programs and activities must "affirmatively further fair housing choice." Restricting such choice limits not only an individual's housing opportunities, but also may limit educational and employment opportunities.

The AI must not only identify impediments to fair housing but also identify warranted actions to eliminate those identified restrictions. To provide accountability, the AI must include goal statements intended to provide the community with an overview of the steps necessary to eliminate the barriers to housing choice, including a five-year action plan with benchmarks, timelines, and responsible parties. Federal requirements mandate an annual review of the action plan. Annual review findings are intended to provide the community and the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA) with an easy-to-read overview of the steps taken to eliminate identified barriers countywide. To continue to receive federal funds for housing programs, the AI must meet planning requirements identified by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and ODSA, as well as be formally adopted by both the City of Lima and Allen County.
